Letter from Reverend Lolla- April 2008

Dear Friends in Christ,

Last month was interesting with Reverend Jeremiah Wright making the headlines for a sermon he preached following the 911 terrorist attacks on America, in 2001. Wright has been Barack Obama's minister for many years. If you did not hear the news reports, Wright made disparaging remarks about America deserving the attacks because of its racism. The maelstrom of anger directed at the United Church of Christ minister, and by association, Obama, displayed the influence upon the public of words spoken by a religious leader. Although the content of Reverend Wright's sermons have been known for some time, the timing of their release was viewed as some to be more than coincidental. Within a few days, Obama disassociated himself from his pastor's message.

Would Reverend Wright's comments have been as controversial if they were not linked to the leading candidate of one of America's political parties? Yes, they would. However, their connection with a candidate for the presidency raised questions about America's future. Will we be led back into the racial hostility that tore at America's heart during the late 1960s? It was perceived the Reverend's views were influential upon his high profile church member, revealing a hidden, unknown side to this candidate for America's highest political office.

Jeremiah Wright exposed what many white Americans fear – black outrage that remains hidden from public view. Had the Reverend crossed the great divide of Church/state separation in his condemnation of America? Or was he simply stating what many want to avoid about their fellow Americans – not all are pleased with the social progress that has been made from the Jim Crow days. But there was another thread to the public outcry against the Chicago preacher.

The visceral rejection of Wright's invoking God's curse upon America in another sermon expressed a deeply held view across the land that our nation was a gross victim of injustice and evil on 911 – plain and simple. There is almost no sympathy among Americans for the impact of freedom of speech spewing forth across the world. Freedom of speech has lost the international respect of many who believe that public modesty is a virtue, especially when it comes to morality. Wright barely touched this theme, however. He seemed preoccupied with sheer condemnation of the nation that allowed him to publicly vilify it without punishing him for treason – although privately, some Americans believe that treason is exactly what the minister preached.

Which raises a question about preaching. To what extent can the gospel be preached without becoming political? Is it simply not mentioning a candidate's name for endorsement from the pulpit? Or is it raising moral and ethical questions about the course of a nation's political leadership when it appears to be straying from God's purposes? Can any nation claim to be "under God" if the public will wants to muzzle the preaching of those biblical themes that challenge – and at points condemn - root assumptions of a nation's social righteousness; even when those unchallenged assumptions contribute to social misery?

I once was told by a friend before I accepted the call to ministry, "Jack, you will be judged by your congregation by how well you are able to get them to drink the castor oil that heals them." Jeremiah Wright could have been more effective if he had used the approach used by many other preachers to help their audiences drink their castor oil – humor. But no one was humorous after 911 – there was no joking about what happened – not even from the pulpits of Jay Leno and David Letterman. A pastor recognizes those occasions when what is needed is pastoral care, not humor nor damnation. Perhaps America's outrage stems from wanting pastoral care from its political leadership as it enters God's future, as well as from its pulpits.
