### Letter to the Congregation

Change is intimidating. Change is inspiring. Change is inevitable. Even as I write my first letter to you as the new Director of Educational Ministries of our church, I am humbled and awed by the changes occurring in not just my family, but the changes occurring in those families around me and in our church, the Presbyterian Church of Plum Creek. At the same time, I would challenge all of us to see change in a different, less intimidating light. Change is the opportunity for growth, humility, and gratitude as we take each step with our Father, who never abandons us to experience these changes alone.

Our lives are constantly in a state of flux, often felt most personally within our families as the economy impacts our jobs and our financial situations or as new babies or grandbabies are born, as our older children begin new school years and head off to college or as new marriages are celebrated while we mourn the loss of loved ones. Our church is also in a period of transition as we seek to address not just the many social and economic pressures that continuously try to attack our personal faiths and our beliefs as a church, but as we seek the Lord's guidance and will in moving forward to continuously serve Him in all that we do, say, and think individually and together.

Certainly change is not an easy part of life; it often challenges the very core of our beings as we seek to uncover what God's desires are in our lives, even if they may not be what we had idealistically imagined. Change is the opportunity to draw even closer to God, to pray more fervently for His divine guidance, and to watch so carefully for our unchanging Father to lead us according to His will. This is not to say that oftentimes there are things that can remain the same, but it is in our willing reception of new ideas and opportunities to serve God in diverse ways that we truly focus on Christ's presence within our own hearts and within the heart of our church. There are so many of these budding possibilities to experience Christ's teachings and example at our church. I would challenge all of us to pray about each one, to seek Christ in each idea, and to be willing to openly discuss whether or not to accept each idea into our church's setting.

So I would suggest to you, while Plum Creek is in its current phase of transition, that we reconsider the word "change" and replace it with "grow." Clearly, our church is in a wonderful place for growth in faith and in fellowship. We are called to grow in our dependence upon God and in our existence as Christians while we follow Christ's example in all that we do, say, and think at home, at work, at play, and at church.

Jesus told us quite explicitly, "I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful...Remain in me, and I will remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me. I am the vine; you are the branches... This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples" (John 15:1-2, 4-5a, 8).

May we continuously strive to be fruitful branches of the vine of Jesus Christ, glorifying God, seeking His will, and demonstrating our discipleship in His name.

### **Christian Education Corner**

Education is not just the job of one person; it is the responsibility we all have to raise up our children to become successful and knowledgeable adults, to provide ourselves with ongoing opportunities to expand our minds and horizons. Christian education carries an even greater responsibility and accountability as we are not just responsible for the depth of mental knowledge of our brothers and sisters in Christ; we are accountable for the eternal salvation of each other. Certainly this responsibility cannot fall solely on the shoulders of one person, especially since the very sacrament of baptism within the church requires the congregation's commitment to join with the newly baptized and his or her family while exemplifying and teaching the baptized about Christ.

Therefore, I am already asking you for help even as I begin my new role in the life of our church. I truly cannot take on this task alone, without your assistance. There are so many ways that you can serve the Lord and share the educational responsibilities that we all are called to have. It can often become too easy to say that we don't have the time or gifts to help with something, but I would challenge you to think otherwise.

1 Corinthians 12 discusses the membership we all have in the body of Christ, however significant or insignificant we believe our role may be. "God has combined the members of the body and has given no greater honor to the parts that lacked it, so that there should be no division in the body, but that its parts should have equal concern for each other. If one part suffers, every part suffers with it; if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it. Now you are the body of Christ, and each of you is a part of it" (1 Cor. 12:24b-27).

As we are all members of the body of Christ and of Christ's church, I would implore you to seek what your role in His church and in the Christian education therein could be. Below, you will find several areas where you could serve the Lord in our Christian education endeavors. Throughout the year, you will learn of more ways that you could help. I ask that, if you feel called to do so, please complete the form below and return it to me at the church either via the collection plate on Sunday mornings or sending it to the church office.
